

Accelerating Clean Energy Adoption among Industries in Odisha

Second Consultation Roundtable

Venue: AIEBA Conference Hall, Bhubaneshwar, Odisha

Summary of the Discussion Points:

- 1. **Policy Awareness and Coordination**: It was noted that there is a need for better dissemination and understanding of the recent provisions of IPR 2022 and MSME Policy 2022 among industry stakeholders and government officials.
- Renewable Energy Awareness: While some MSMEs have successfully adopted solar power
 and other renewable energy technologies, there is still a significant portion that lacks basic
 knowledge and understanding of these options.
- 3. **Ease of Access to Policy Benefits**: Participants highlighted the complexity and lack of clarity in the current application process for policy benefits. A single-window application system and a support desk could address these issues effectively.
- 4. **Demand Aggregation**: Aggregating demand at the Industry Association level was proposed as a strategy to attract more attention from implementing agencies, investors, and financiers, leading to better incentives and value for money.
- 5. **Capacity Building and Awareness**: Regular engagements, awareness campaigns, and capacity-building initiatives are essential for MSMEs to fully benefit from renewable energy incentives and to ensure high-quality RE system implementations.
- 6. **Group and Virtual Net Metering**: There are currently statutory challenges in implementing group and virtual net metering across different DISCOM jurisdictions in Odisha, which need to be addressed.
- 7. **Cost Comparison and Benchmark Pricing**: Industries need support in evaluating and comparing proposals from developers to ensure informed decision-making and better financial outcomes.
